ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL) 9-12

Chapter 74.11 (d) (1) English language arts—four credits. The credits must consist of:

- (A) English I and English II (ESOL I and II may be substituted for English I and II for immigrant students only); and
- (B) English III (no substitutes for English III) and English IV or its equivalent are required courses for each ESL student.

ESOL I and ESOL II may substitute for English I and English II with regards to state graduation credit for **immigrant students only**. **Immigrant students are those not born in the USA**. English III and English IV (or equivalents) are required for all ESL students. All credits earned in ESOL that are not counted toward the graduation requirement in English may be counted as electives in meeting state graduation requirements.

The **Calculus BC AP** topics are typically included in two-semester sequence (Calculus I and II) at the college level. Students may take one calculus examination in a given year. It is the district's recommendation that students planning to take the Calculus AB AP exam enroll for 3 semesters of Calculus, to include 0-0-233-1.
