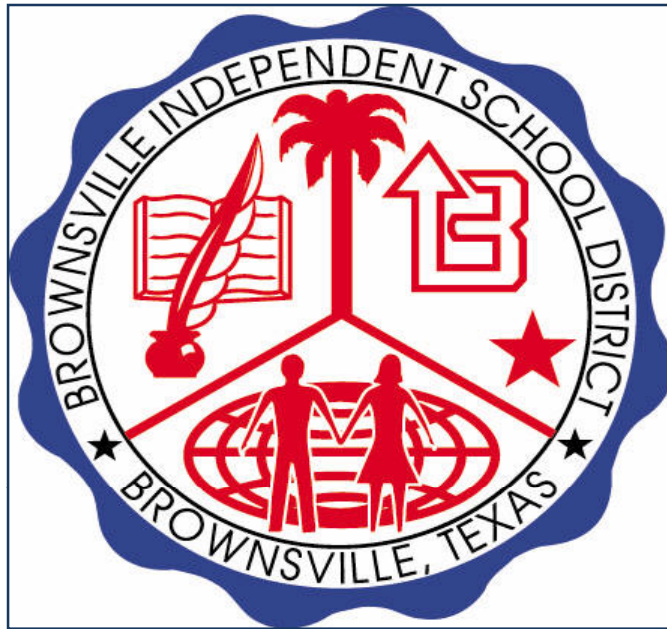

Brownsville Independent School District Assessment, Research and Evaluation

During the spring 2008 test administration, 96.5% of all students enrolled in grades 3-11 were tested with TAKS, TAKS Accommodated, TAKS-M or TAKS-ALT, an increase of 0.8 percentage points from 2007. 84.8% of the tested students were included in the 2008 accountability system.

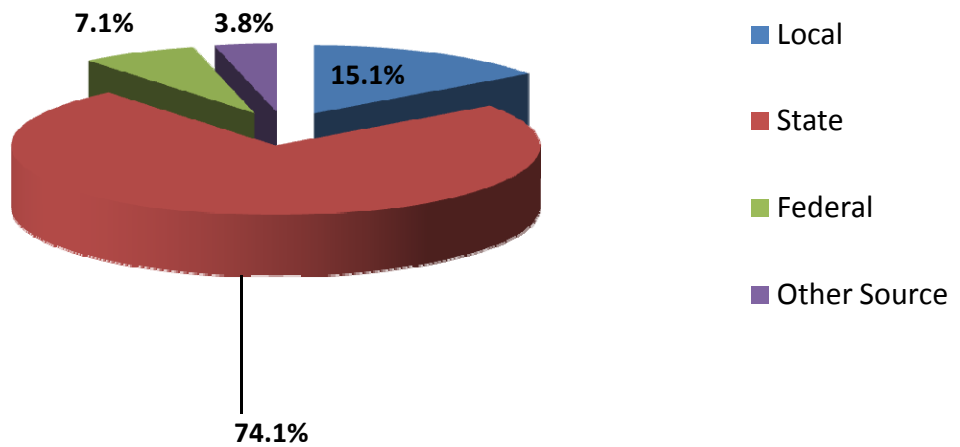
