The ACTA assessments support testing professionals and promote best practices related to test security. Before you can proctor a test, you must pass the ACTA assessment.

What's the ACTA?

- The ACCUPLACER® Certificate of Test Administration (ACTA) is an annual requirement that ensures all proctors can securely administer assessments. All proctors must have a thorough understanding of ACCUPLACER test security policies and proctoring guidelines.
- As a Proctor Reporter or Proctor, you must pass this assessment with a score of 100% to receive your ACCUPLACER login credentials.

How do I prepare?

- **Training materials** are available on the Resources menu of the ACCUPLACER platform. The materials are accessible even if you can't access other features of the platform.
- Give yourself enough study time. Print out the training materials and prepare on your own or with a team.
