- Appropriate and relevant textual citations and references.
- Minimum 150 words, **each** response question; INCLUDE a minimum of one CITED QUOTATION and one illustrated example for each of the three response questions.
- MUST be typed and submitted through the Canvas learning platform.
- Less than 10% summary stick to analysis

NOTE: The questions are designed to guide the reader through the entire novel, and the student should be prepared to further discuss each question in a discussion post. <u>The assignment MUST</u> <u>be submitted through the Canvas learning platform.</u>
