Assignment – Read, Othello by William Shakespeare.

- As you read, complete the yearbook project. See attached directions and examples.
- The student should complete the entire yearbook project and be prepared to discuss **questions** in an online forum
- Submit your completed project to your English IV teacher by Friday, August 28, 2020. (This project will be a major grade.) See Rubric. The assignment MUST be submitted through the Canvas learning platform.

- 4. quotation that shows something about the person and what is important to him or her;
- 5. favorites such as colors and foods;
- 6. a book that has had a great impact on him or her;
- 7. voted "most-likely-to" what?;
