Intra-District Transfers begins Saturday, May 15, 2021

For Current BISD 8th-11th Grade Students

Intra-district Transfer applications for current BISD students in grades 8–11 will be accepted online at the Pupil Services website

<https://pupilservices3966.wixsite.com/pupilservices> beginning **Saturday, May 15, 2021 until**

Sunday, August 1, 2021 for the 2021-2022 school year. Upon verification of eligibility requirements, student transfer approval will be based on space availability at the requested campus and grade level.

As per policy FDB (LOCAL), when requesting an intradistrict transfer a student shall:

1. Have passed required sections of state-mandated assessments (SPED exemptions may apply);
2. Have met attendance goal for credit requirements; and
3. Have not been suspended out of school, removed to BAC or placed at JJAEP.

When applying for a student transfer, parents shall provide the following:

1. Proof of residence in the parent's name through a current utility bill, utility deposit, unexpired lease, or rent receipt with owner's address and telephone;
2. Parent's photo identification; and
3. Student's local identification number (Student ID number).

All prior approved Intra-District student transfers will continue for the same campus, provided that the enrollment is uninterrupted. Parents and students must assume responsibility for the following as outlined in the Intra-District transfer application:

- ▶ Meet the district attendance goal for credit requirements;
- ▶ Pass all classes with a grade no lower than 70;
- ▶ Follow campus/district discipline rules;
- ▶ Cooperate with the school staff at the transfer school; and
- ▶ Provide transportation to the requested school, ensuring the child arrives on time to class and is promptly picked up.

PLEASE NOTE

Approval of an Intra-district Transfer does not imply eligibility to participate in extra- curricular or UIL activities (athletics, academics, fine arts, etc.), special programs, transportation, or placement in the student's present high school ranking at the requested high school. Feeder patterns will not establish the school of attendance for students attending campuses outside of their zone.

A student granted a transfer shall follow UIL defined residency requirements as outlined in the most current edition of the UIL constitution and contest rules in order to participate in UIL competition. Each transfer shall be reviewed on an individual basis to ensure consistency with UIL requirements. The district recommends that parents contact the campus principal, athletic director or fine arts administrator for clarification on UIL requirements.
