CCMR 2020 VERIFIER

The College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR) Verifier has been released by TEA. Campuses should use the CCMR Verifier to verify the accuracy of their CCMR data and, if needed, submit official documentation to correct data by July 14, 2021. If no discrepancies are found, no action is required. Each campus can find their student listing in the t-drive, 2021>CCMR>CCMR 2020 Verifier. Remember this is your 2020 class not your 2021 class.

Please note that data from TSDS PEIMS submissions are not eligible for corrections, and therefore, are not shown. Campuses SHOULD NOT submit industry-based certification (IBC) documentation through the level I and level II certificates field; IBCs are not eligible for correction.

CCMR data is shown for 2019–20 annual graduates and non-graduating 12th graders. As all districts and campuses receive a Not Rated label in 2021, this data will only be reported.

What steps should you take?

Q: What is the CCMR Verifier?

The CCMR Verifier provides campuses an opportunity to verify the accuracy of their CCMR data and, if needed, submit official documentation to correct data. CCMR data is shown for 2019–20 annual graduates and non-graduating 12th graders. Typically these data are used to determine academic accountability ratings; however, due to districts and campuses receiving a Not Rated: Declared State of Disaster label for 2021, the data are report only.

Q: What action is required?

Campuses are required to verify CCMR outcomes provided by testing vendors and outside entities for 2019–20 annual graduates and non-graduating 12th graders. If the campus does not find any discrepancies or wish to request changes, no action is required. If discrepancies are found, campuses must request changes with supporting documentation.

Please note, CCMR indicators determined by TSDS PEIMS submissions are not eligible for corrections, and therefore, are not shown.




